

Convicted Felons and Voting

Ex-offenders – you can vote once if you have completed:

In Texas, **a convicted felon automatically regains the right to vote** after completing his or her sentence.

Once an ex-offender completes the punishment phase **including all of**

- any term of incarceration,
- parole
- supervision
- probation ordered by the court

the ex-offender is eligible to register and vote in the state of Texas.

In addition people can vote if they have been pardoned or otherwise released from the resulting disability to vote; and they have not been determined by a final judgment of a court exercising probate jurisdiction to be (1) totally mentally incapacitated; or (2) partially mentally incapacitated without the right to vote.

Ex-offenders should re-register to vote.

**The deadline to register for the November election
is Monday, October 6, 2014**

For convicted felons currently incarcerated, on parole or probation:

Individuals convicted of a felony **are ineligible to vote** while incarcerated, on parole, or on probation.
